July 14, 15, 2012 The Navy of 1812: Sailors on the Lakes



Naval encampment on the grounds of Navy Hall, Niagara-on-the-Lake, with 5 tall ships (4 Brigantines and a schooner-1812 Squadron) and 22 longboats with 300 naval re-enactors. <u>Saturday</u> July 14, plans call for a Longboat Processional Row at noon and at 2;00

pm an Assault landing exercise at Queens Royal Park featuring Defence Force marines and a "sham battle". "The Sailors' World in 1812" encampment features period music of "Gin Lane" and dancing demonstrations by the Fort York Regency Dancers. Sat at 7:00 pm there will be "Battle through the Fort" re-enactment at Fort George. **Sunday July 15th** there will be a 10:00 am Military Parade down Queen St and at 11:00 am a Naval Salute at Queens Royal Park. 2:00 pm is a final "Battle through the Fort" re-enactment at Fort George. BATTLE OF QUEENSTON HEIGHTS - October 13th, 2012 BURIAL OF BROCK - October 16th, 2012 October 12 & 13 - The Battle of Queenston Heights October 12 is a special education day offering tours of the battlefield -contact: admin@friendsoffortgeorge.ca



October 13 - In the morning, hundreds of re-enactors will make the historic march from Fort George to Queenston Heights. During the day there will military demonstrations, tours of the battlefield, music and period

merchants. **Starting at 3:00 pm there will be a dramatic reenactment of the battle of Queenston Heights**, including the death of Brock, native skirmishes and the successful attack by Roger Hale Sheaffe. This followed by a ceremony at the base of the monument to commemorate those who fell during the war. At dusk, Brock's body will be taken away on a wagon, followed by a fireworks display. Food services, parking, and shuttle bus services are being arranged.

October 14 - The Burial of Brock Re-enactment - Funeral procession starting at 12:00 noon from Fort George for a ceremony in front of the Court House on Queen Street near the original site of the Government House where the carts carrying Brock and Macdonell will be placed in the procession. The troops will then slow march to St Mark's Church where there will be a musical commemoration. Then to Brock's bastion in Fort George by 2:30. There will be a Drumhead Service, hundreds of re-enactors, with the public participating in the parade to Fort George. Closing ceremonies will honour the 200 years of peace and friendship that has existed between Canada and the United States.
